History of the Quilt Trail

In 2001 Donna Sue Groves, in Adams County, Ohio painted a quilt block on her barn to honor her mother, a master quilter. From that humble beginning has grown a national movement of counties and communities developing their own trail of quilts on barns, houses and other buildings throughout America. More than 30 states now have Quilt Trails with over 3,000 registered quilt blocks. The movement shows no sign of stopping.



Our History

Ogemaw County has a rich tradition of farming and quilting. In the early 1900's many Amish and Mennonite families from Indiana and Ohio came to farm the land after the lumbering companies had logged off the forests. The early settlers brought with them their tradition of being good farmers and their wives brought their family quilts. What better way to honor their sacrifices and struggles; their triumphs and tenacity than to commemorate them with quilt blocks on barns?


shop and spend time here.

In making this application, I agree to accept the following conditions and requirements:

- I understand that the Ogemaw County Quilt Trail (OCQT) Committee will determine appropriateness of sites for placement of quilt blocks based on visibility, traffic density, maintenance of building and premises.
- I will work with OCQT in developing the design of the proposed quilt block and site story for OCQT publications. I will also help or make arrangements for volunteers to paint the quilt block.
- OCQT will publish a block photo and story that will appear in our brochure and on community website, as well as news media and future publications and promotions.
- The quilt block cannot be a company logo, nor can the installed block be used as a company logo.
- No other graphics, slogans or quotes may be on the same side of the barn/building as the quilt block without approval of the committee. Name and date is okay.
- The site must be accessible by a bucket truck for installation (if required) and not encumbered with power lines.
- The block recipient is responsible for installation and maintenance of the block.
- The quilt block must remain on the building for at least five years.
- Once the block design has been agreed upon, no changes may be made to the block and it cannot be moved or altered in any way without agreement by the OCQT.
- I will allow my barn/building to be photographed by the public and photos to be used by OCQT in promoting the Quilt Trail, with my name and/or my business name to be used on promotional materials and community website.
- OCQT brochures will remind visitors on the Quilt Trail to be respectful of private property and ask permission before photographing people in conjunction with the quilt block or building.
- I agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Ogemaw County Quilt Trail the West Branch Area Chamber of Commerce, Ogemaw County Genealogical and Historical Society and West Branch Creative Arts Association as well as its officers, committees, agents and employees for and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses and causes of action related to the quilt block.
